# ECML Kontaktpunkt Danmark -for en bedre kvalitet på alle trin i sprogundervisningen

#### Dear all,

You have hereby received the third and last newsletter for 2017 from ECML Contact Point Denmark. In 2017, we have seen a great increase in the number of different activities just like the contact-network has been significantly expanded with key language professionals and institutions from Denmark and Europe. ECML Contact Point Denmark has been more visible at fairs/exhibitions, generalforsamlinger, workshops and conferences, and through articles in different journals.

We have already planned some of our activities for 2018 and it will be another exciting year, especially in regards to consolidating the Contact Point's main role as a network and knowledge center and thereby reaching an adequate position in the language strategical development process.



ECML Contact Point Denmark organized its fourth national language conference Sprog på Kryds og Tværs on 25th of September 2017 at Dokk1 in Aarhus, the European Capital of Culture 2017. Our keynote Jo Angouri (Warwick University in Great Britain & Aalto University in Finland) held a presentation on The politics of talk at work. Afterwards, participants from the Danish education system and the business community gave short presentations on their own experiences both in regards to requirements, already existing teaching approaches, and new ways of thinking language acquisition and cultural competence. The afternoon included roundtables where everyone had the opportunity to discuss and reflect on the future employees' linguistic and intercultural competences in a globalized world. The European Language Label was presented again this year at the ECML language conference. Each year it is awarded to innovative projects or people who has contributed to the development of teaching languages. This year the prize was awarded to two projects: Lær dansk med rap (Zoran Lekovic) which teaches refugees and students how to pronounce Danish words by rapping them and the project Wise Words (Gro Caspersen) which is about using students' plurilingual competences in the teaching.

The headquarter of ECML in Graz has this year chosen ECML Contact Point Denmark's language conference as one of the 16 most inspiring initiatives (in celebration of The European Day of Languages' 16<sup>th</sup> birthday).

#### The European Day of Language 26th of September 2017



In 2017 we saw an increasing interest in The European Day of Language in comparison to last year here in Denmark. This year, the Contact Point has sent out many language packages to Danish institutions (CFU, schools, municipalities, and language teachers associations).

The Contact Point has, in collaboration with the representation for the European Commission in Denmark, organized a language quiz on their website. Many people took the quiz and 10 lucky winners were rewarded with a goodie-bag from the European Commission.

This year, the Contact Point organized also with the representation from the European Commission in Denmark, a public event at DOKK1 to celebrate the Day of Language. In a language café, the participants could hear a bit about some of Europe's many interesting languages. Volunteers from the whole of Europe gave small introductions to their mother tongue. There was a talk from associate professor Sébastien Doubinsky (AU) about *The Odyssey – a journey through Europe*. Both visiting classes from schools and universities participated as well as regular guests at the library.

In 2017 the programme <u>"Languages at the heart of learning"</u> was in full swing. As a new initiative in this programme's period, ECML organized three <u>Think Tanks</u>. In two of them Danish participants were chosen: Karen Lund (DPU, Aarhus University) for *Whole-school teacher cooperation for support in the language(s) of schooling* and Julia Feller (Aarhus University) for *Language learning pathways*. This means that we now have Danish participants in the current programme period.
