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Young migrants - Supporting multilingual classrooms ECML Training and Consultancy in Nyborg 24-25 August 2018



What is the Supporting Multilingual Classrooms initiative?

The Supporting Multilingual Classrooms initiative provides training workshops in the member states of the European Union and the European Centre for Modern Languages (ECML) of the Council of Europe on the linguistic integration of migrant learners in schools in Europe. In this way, it supports member states in accessing quality education and furthermore, helps in bridging the gap between these learners and non-migrant pupils. The initiative draws on a wide range of successful ECML projects and resources which focus on inclusive, plurilingual and intercultural approaches.

The workshops offer tailored support to various educational stakeholders, including teachers, teacher educators, administrators and school leaders, on how best to develop learners' competences in the language/s of schooling, whilst valuing all children's home languages and drawing on these languages as a rich resource for learning.

The initiative is carried out within the framework of a cooperation agreement between the European Centre for Modern Languages and the European Commission, entitled Innovative Methodologies and Assessment in Language Learning.

DEVELOPING A WHOLE-SCHOOL APPROACH TO VALUING AND SUPPORTING LINGUISTIC AND CULTURAL DIVERSITY

The workshop aims to support the development of whole school language policies, strategies and practices to promote positive attitudes to linguistic and cultural diversity, to value and support multilingualism and plurilingualism and to facilitate the inclusion of learners from migrant backgrounds.

Workshop objectives:

- to create an inclusive school environment in which all languages, including all home languages, are valued as part of a learner's education;
- to ensure that all members of the school's community have opportunities to develop awareness of the value of multilingualism for all and integrate these opportunities into their practices;
- to engage with the wider community, including parents and community groups, businesses and other key partners, in the task of promoting multilingualism.
